#### Welcome to our new and returning Dixon families!

To encourage sustainability and liter-free lunches, we once again ask students to bring their own cutlery on hot lunch days, as well as plates for pizza days. These items will **not** be supplied.

#### MunchaLunch

For the September to January school period, Munchal unch ordering will be **OPEN** as of **Wednesday, September 7, 2022.** We encourage parents to place orders for all available food days in one session to avoid missed days and disappointment. Orders may be paid by credit card or PayPal account. Orders will close <u>7 days</u> (1 week) in advance of the respective date. All orders that have not been paid for by then will be cancelled/removed from the system.

If your child has been assigned a classroom already, please update with their classroom. This can also be done in the "My Family" → "My Children" section of the system.

## **ORANGE SHIRT DAY SEPTEMBER 29TH**

Dear Dragon Families,

I am happy to report our students are settling into their new learning communities. At Dixon, our learning communities are combined grade classes consisting of students in two consecutive grades grouped together in one class. Combined classes are common both locally and internationally, with "one out of every five Canadian students enrolled in a multi-grade classroom" according to at least one study. All our students will be in a combined class for every grade at school in Richmond. In some rare occasions due to numbers there may be single grade. This year we have one class out of fifteen classes in this situation.

Organizing classes to best meet the needs of all students is a complex process. While practical factors such as shifting enrolment, class size and composition influence the formation of classes, the Dixon is committed to creating balanced classes that focus on students' learning strengths and the needs of the whole child.

There are academic, as well as social, benefits to combined grade classes. Studies indicate that children in combined classes do as well academically as children in single grades.

Research has shown that combined classes:

- allow students learn from one another,
- provide models for younger students,
- help older students see what they have already learned,
- provide opportunities for a greater range of learning,
- encourage students to work together,
- promote social responsibility,
- help students to become independent and
- foster a positive attitude toward school.

Parents often ask how students are assigned to combined classes and what reasoning goes into deciding whether a student should be placed with older or younger students. It is often assumed that the "brighter" students are placed with older children and those who are less able are placed with younger children. This is not an effective way to compose classes and does not occur. There is a misconception among some of our community that students the older grade in a combined class have more academic needs or perhaps need to review curriculum from the lower grade. This is false and wrong. Our combined classes teach to the child and their strengths and stretches. We work very hard to change up students so that in some years they are the older in a combined classes and sometimes they are the younger. In every classroom, there is a wide range of skills and abilities as children mature at different rates in various aspects of development. Teachers are aware of these individual differences and structure learning activities according to the needs of each learner.

Teachers are skilled and trained to provide instruction to diverse classes of students, working to meet the learning needs of each child regardless of their grade level.

Combined classes offer enhanced opportunities for all students to demonstrate confidence, positive self-concept, and a strong sense of belonging. Combined classes can help students form broader and more varied friendships as older students provide role models for younger students. Sometimes the teacher/student relationship can be enhanced if the same teacher teaches a student for more than one year, leading to increased feelings of security for returning students and a smoother transition in September because the teacher already knows their learning styles and needs well. Teachers in combined classes, like those in straight grades, follow the curriculum requirements defined by the Ministry of Education.
