Black Excellence Day was created by
Ninandotoo Society and takes place on
January 15th each year, or the preceding
Friday if it falls on a weekend or holiday.
This virtual event is an opportunity for
students and staff to learn about the
contributions of Black Canadians, and their
ongoing civil rights struggle. The term
"Black Excellence" was born out of the civil
rights movement in the 1960's and honours
great civil rights leader, Dr. Martin Luther
King Jr. who was born on January 15, 1929.

Viola Desmond was a Black
Canadian businesswoman
who was born in 1914 in
Halifax, Nova Scotia. Viola
stood up to racism by
challenging the workers at a
movie theatre that
segregated black and white
audiences. Viola is the first
black person to be printed on
Canadian currency.
