Cold and flu season is in full swing!

We've noticed that a

lot of students have been coming to school sick.

It's important to ensure that any person entering the school completes a daily health check.

A daily health check means checking yourself or your child for new symptoms of illness. Symptoms include: fever, stuffy or runny nose, cough, vomitting or diarrhea. If you or your child do not pass this daily check, please stay home until you're feeling better. Please call the school's early warning line to inform us if your child will be absent.

We request that students who have been sick may return to school after they've been symptom free for at least 24 hours.

If a teacher or staff observes a student with new or worsening symptoms of illness, we may call home for the student to be picked up early. Thank you for doing your part in keeping our community safe and healthy!

We have now activated the SMS/text messaging communication feature for schools with the goal of improving our ability to deliver time-sensitive information to parents/caregivers, including emergency notifications and important school messages. Approximately 50% of our parent/caregivers have not yet subscribed to receive text messages. Please continue to remind parents in your school communications that if they have not yet opted-in to receive text messages, they are encouraged to do so by sending a text message to the number 978338 with 'Yes' in the body.

On December 21st you will receive your child's second learning update. The second written update is sent to you through the MyEd Parent Portal. Parents/Guardians who are new to Dixon will receive an automated email with their user and temporary password - please be sure to check your junk and spam folders. Passwords can be reset through the platform. The Richmond School District continues to move towards electronic learning summaries for viewing on MyEd for all learners. We understand that accessing the report can be challenging for some families and as such we are printing a copy for every learner for our first term. Please try to log in to your MyEd Parent Portal to view and SAVE your child's Learning Update. They are only available for the duration of the current term and will not be accessible when the following term's learning update is published.

Please take time to go over your child's learning update to celebrate their strengths and plan for next steps for their stretches.

Richmond School District 38 is excited to welcome Kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2019, turning 5 in 2024. These children will begin Kindergarten in September 2024. Online registration opens on November 1, 2023. Please visit our website www.sd38.bc.ca/kindergarten for more information about our online registration process, required documents, important dates, and FAOs.

We encourage families to complete their registration within the Priority 1 registration window, which spans from November to January, in order to maximize their chances of securing a spot at their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 2, 2024.

Videos detailing Kindergarten registration have been made available on our District website, providing new parents with guidance on the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options (Early French Immersion and Montessori). The City of Richmond Community Bylaws have advised us their officers have observed an increase in drivers stopping their vehicles on marked crosswalks during pick-up and drop-off times. Vehicles stopped on marked crosswalks create challenges for pedestrians to cross safely, cause sightline obstructions, and make it difficult for drivers of oncoming vehicles to see them, posing a significant safety risk — especially during this time of year with less daylight. We ask that drivers not park in front of the school along Diamond Road in areas marked no parking and no stopping. When there is a car parked and two cars are trying to go by it creates a dangerous situation. With no sidewalks and many people walking to their cars or walking to their homes in the neighborhood, we ask that cars please observe the traffic signs and always drive well below the 30 km speed limit.

Bylaw enforcement officers will be issuing tickets for vehicles stopping on marked crosswalks and may issue tickets for vehicles parked in not stopping and no parking areas.
