The Dixon Reader's Choice Awards is a much-anticipated annual literacy program at our school. Each year, students explore a wide range of titles across several categories, including French and English picture books, chapter books, and graphic novels.

Right now, we are running the chapter book and graphic novel categories for intermediate grades, with ten high-interest titles selected to appeal to a wide range of readers.


For every Reader's Choice book read, students complete an entry form, and book prize draws are held throughout the program. Later this spring, students who have read three or more books are invited to take part in Voting Day to choose their favourite. This popular program encourages reading for pleasure and is made possible through the generous support of the Dixon PAC.

Here are two books featured in this year's program:



### **The Last Dragon on Mars** by Scott Reintgen

Set on a struggling Mars colony, this fast-paced science fiction novel follows thirteen-year-old Lunar Jones, who discovers that Martian dragons still exist. Blending adventure, friendship, and responsibility, this book is a high-interest read for students who enjoy action, fantasy, and imaginative worlds.



### **Very Bad at Math** by Hope Larson

This relatable graphic novel follows Verity Nelson, a high-achieving student who excels at almost everything, except math. When she learns she has *dyscalculia*, Verity begins to understand her struggles in a new way. Told with humour and heart, this story opens important conversations about learning differences, perseverance, and self-advocacy.
